The African Institute of International Law is pleased to announce that it will be conducting the first African Law Seminar, in cooperation with the African Union, to educate law students fit to practice law in Africa in the 21st century in furtherance of the goals of the African Union Theme of Education for the Year 2024.

The inaugural lecture will be given by Abdulqawi A. Yusuf, Judge and former President of the International Court of Justice, and the founder of the African Institute of International Law. The topic of the lecture will be *Pan-Africanism and the Public Law of Africa*.

The African Union Legal Counsel and Director for Legal Affairs, Professor Hajer Gueldich, will provide a series of lectures on the *African Union, its Structure, Law and Policies*.

The African Institute of International Law is pleased to invite law schools in Africa to register for the seminar by submitting the completed application form by 14 March 2025. Law schools are encouraged to register as soon as possible due to space constraints. The seminar will be conducted in English. The African Institute plans to conduct a similar seminar in French depending on resources. **The seminar is open to all law schools in Africa free of charge.**
